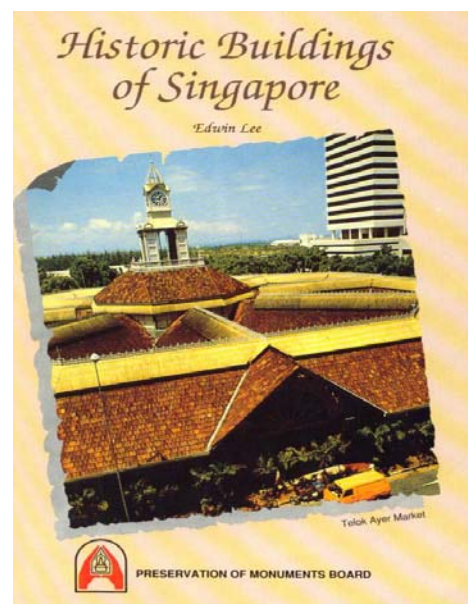

Granite and Chunam: two of the commonly-employed materials in the early buildings of Singapore, and indeed, used in the construction of many of its national monuments.

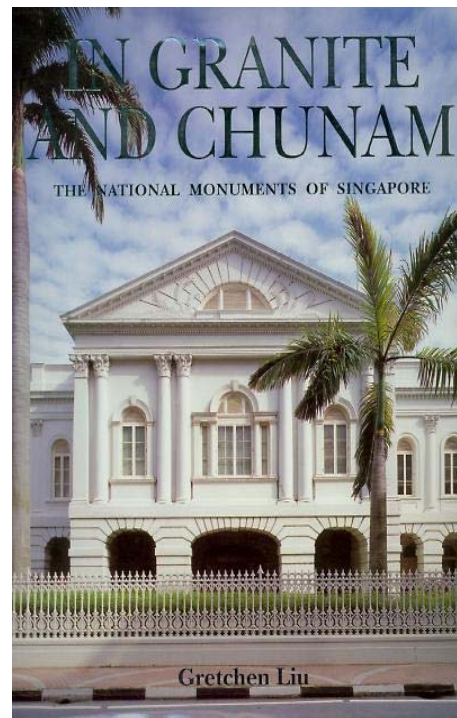

Each offers an intimate slice of social history while many touch a deep chord that transcends cultural and religious differences.

Without them, Singapore would be bereft.

*In Granite and Chunam* presents the monuments as the old friends that they are. The lively text tells the story of each building in a fresh and inspiring manner. Rare and remarkable photographs and building plans, many never before published, flesh out its telling.

This is, in more ways than one, a landmark book.



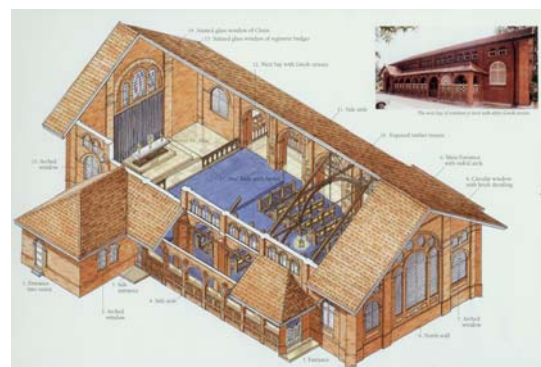
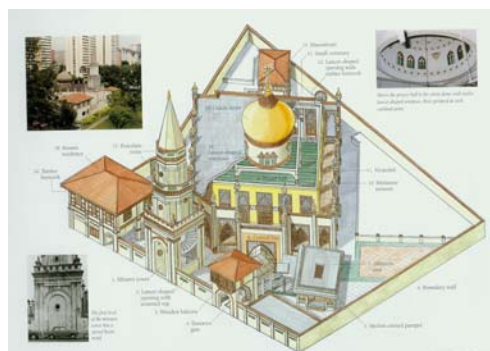
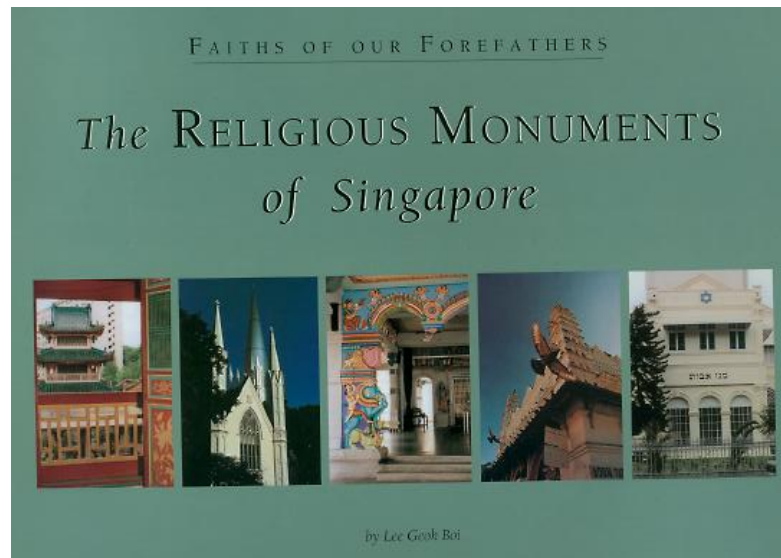
